

David Giampetroni is the managing attorney of Kanji & Katzen, PLLC, with offices in Seattle, Washington, Ann Arbor, Michigan, and Flagstaff, Arizona. Kanji & Katzen represents tribal governments exclusively on a range of issues critical to tribal sovereignty. David's practice centers on matters including land claims and reservation boundaries, tribal court jurisdiction, gaming and tribal environmental rights. David represents tribes primarily in litigation in federal courts, though in tribal and state courts as well. He served as lead counsel in *Murphy v. Royal*, 866 F.3d 1164 (10th Cir. 2017), where the United States Court of Appeals for the Tenth Circuit held that the Creek Nation's 1866 reservation boundaries remain legally intact. David and his colleagues presently represent the Creek Nation in defending that decision in the United States Supreme Court. *See Carpenter v. Murphy*, No. 17-1107 (2018). The *Murphy* litigation is the topic of David's presentation today.
